Design in the Times of Scarcity: Architecture, Money and Diminishing Resources

Jeremy Till
University of the Arts London

The lecture will combine two parts of Jeremy Till's recent work. First his exploration of what the broad theme of scarcity might mean to architectural design, and second the way that money (a subject too often hidden in architectural discourse) needs to be surfaced and addressed. The lecture argues that new economic contexts demand new spatial conditions that move beyond the standard forms of architecture. It also suggests that the modes of designing need to shift to encompass new methods and values that avoid current obsessions with form, taste and tectonics. The lecture draws on this book *The Design of Scarcity* and the recent issue of *Ardeth: Money*.
